

**Waterford Township Supervisors
Regular Business Meeting
September 21, 2022**

Chairman Senger called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., followed by the salute to the flag. Supervisors Kondzielski and Smith were in attendance as was Roadmaster Jerry Hanas, Secretary/Treasurer Sharon Risjan, Solicitor Martinucci, Ron Eliason, Zoning Officer Lindsay Ethridge, Lisa Glover, John & Elaine Martens, and Matt Erickson.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Matt Erickson, Barton Road, asked when Barton Road would be tar and chipped. Jerry explained that we have to change culverts and prep the road before we can tar and chip. It will probably be done in 2024.

Lisa Glover introduced John and Elaine Martens, the owners of the barn at the corner of Route 97/Flatts Rd. This facility has been remodeled as an events venue, and is now open.

TREASURER'S REPORT

ROADMASTER – See attached report

Regarding the pipe replacement at the east end of Dublin Road, he has contacted Green Distributors for pricing. Pipe prices have come down since July, but will cost close to \$20,000. 12-15 weeks for delivery. We did get the permit. There was discussion on bidding that project out because of the size of the pipe.

PLANNING & ZONING – See attached report

Lindsay was approached by a resident about the variance approval for a property at Old State/Plank Road. There is contention with the neighbors. The person who got the variance told them the Township gave him the property. It was noted that all the Township did was grant a variance for where the building is now so the owner could repair it. Lindsay will look into the property in question at the court house.

SOLICITOR –

Resolution 2022-06 implementing Act 57 of 2022 for the Property Tax Penalty Waiver Provisions. He explained that this would waive penalties for a new property owner who did not receive their first tax bill.

Waterford Boro Municipal Authority PUC Issue – was discussed in executive session.

Personnel Code – He is working on it and waiting for comments from the supervisors.

WATER/SEWER AUTHORITY –

Kondzielski indicated that everyone got a copy of Steve Halmi's letter regarding an alternate configuration for the backflow preventer at Shearer's.

OLD BUSINESS

NIEMEYER ROAD BRIDGE UPDATE – The bridge now has more structural damage. On 9/20/22, a fully loaded triaxle dump truck was traveling north west on Old Wattsburg Road, lost his brakes, came down Hood Road, across Union Road, across the railroad track, and into the bridge. This project was supposed to go out for bid on September 15 but did not. Jerry is going to protect the bridge with fence and is waiting on a proposal from Hi-T Fencing.

Motion by Smith, seconded by Senger, to designate Flory Kondzielski as Waterford Township's Hazard Mitigation Contact. Vote: 3/0

Motion by Kondzielski, seconded by Smith, authorizing Harry Latta to conduct CPR training and AED training for our employees and Planning Commission members who wish to participate. Cost is \$20/person with certification good for two years. Vote: 3/0

Chairman recessed the meeting at 7:57 p.m. to executive session, for the purpose of Water/Sewer Authority PUC issue discussion. Meeting resumed at 8:08 p.m.



At the September 21, 2022, regular business meeting, the Board of Supervisors took action to comply with Act 57 of 2022, which requires the Township to adopt a resolution directing the elected tax collector to implement the Act between October 10, 2022, and January 9, 2023.

Attached you will find Waterford Township's Resolution #2022-06, as well as a copy of Act 57 of 2022, which allows taxpayers who fail to receive a tax notice during their first year of occupancy, to apply for and receive a waiver of penalties and additional costs from the tax collector. As indicated, the PA Department of Community and Economic Development is required to make a waiver form available. The new act takes effect on October 10, 2022.

RESOLUTION # 2022-06

RESOLUTION TO IMPLEMENT ACT 57 OF 2022 PROPERTY TAX PENALTY WAIVER PROVISIONS

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Supervisors of Waterford Township, Erie County, PA, to implement Act 57 of 2022.

WHEREAS, Act 57 of 2022, amending the Local Tax Collection Law, was signed by Governor Wolf on July 11, 2022, and takes effect on October 10, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Act 57 requires taxing districts that impose taxes on the assessed value of real property to adopt a resolution or ordinance within 90 days of the effective date of the act, or not later than January 9, 2023, directing the tax collector to waive additional charges for real estate taxes in certain situations; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tax Collector of Waterford Township comply with the provisions of Act 57 and this resolution for tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2023.

DEFINITIONS

The following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them within this resolution unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

Additional charge: Any interest, fee, penalty, or charge accruing to and in excess of the face amount of the real estate tax as provided in the real estate tax notice.

Qualifying event:

1. For the purposes of real property, the date of transfer of ownership.
2. For manufactured or mobile homes, the date of transfer of ownership or the date a lease agreement commences for the original location or relocation of a manufactured or mobile home on a parcel of land not owned by the owner of the manufactured or mobile home. The term does not include the renewal of a lease for the same location.

Tax Collector: The elected tax collector for Waterford Township, Erie County, PA, any authorized or designated delinquent tax collector, the Erie County Tax Claim Bureau, or any alternative collector of taxes as provided for in the act of July 7, 1947 (P.L. 1368, No. 542), known as the "Real Estate Tax Sale Law," an employee, agent or assignee authorized to collect the tax, a purchase of claim for the tax or any other person authorized by law or contract to secure collection of, or take any action at law or in equity against the person or property of the taxpayer for the real estate tax or amounts, liens or claims derived from the real estate tax.

WAIVER


The Tax Collector shall, for tax years beginning on and after January 1, 2023, grant a request to waive additional charges for real estate taxes if the taxpayer does all of the following:


- A. Provides a waiver request of additional charges, on a form provided by the PA Department of Community and Economic Development, to the Tax Collector in possession of the claim within twelve (12) months of a qualifying event;
- B. Attests that a tax notice was not received; and
- C. Provides the Tax Collector in possession of the claim with one of the following:
 - 1. A copy of the deed showing the date of real property transfer; or
 - 2. A copy of the title following the acquisition of a mobile or manufactured home subject to taxation as real estate showing the date of issuance, or a copy of an executed lease agreement between the owner of a mobile or manufactured home and the owner of a parcel of land on which the mobile or manufactured home will be situated showing the date the lease commences; and
- D. Pays the face value amount of the tax notice for the real estate tax with the waiver request.

ADOPTED by Waterford Township this 21st day of September 2022.



**LOCAL TAX COLLECTION LAW - EFFECT OF FAILURE TO RECEIVE TAX
NOTICE**

Act of Jul. 11, 2022, P.L. 701, No. 57

Cl. 72

Session of 2022

No. 2022-57

HB 430

AN ACT

Amending the act of May 25, 1945 (P.L.1050, No.394), entitled "An act relating to the collection of taxes levied by counties, county institution districts, cities of the third class, boroughs, towns, townships, certain school districts and vocational school districts; conferring powers and imposing duties on tax collectors, courts and various officers of said political subdivisions; and prescribing penalties," further providing for effect of failure to receive tax notice.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 7 of the act of May 25, 1945 (P.L.1050, No.394), known as the Local Tax Collection Law, is amended to read:

Section 7. Effect of Failure to Receive Tax Notice.--(a)

Failure to receive notice shall not relieve any taxpayer from the payment of any taxes imposed by any taxing district, and such taxpayer shall be charged with his taxes as though he had received notice.

(b) (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a taxing district shall, within ninety days of the effective date of this subsection, by ordinance or resolution, require a tax collector to waive additional charges for real estate taxes beginning in the first tax year after the effective date of this subsection, if the taxpayer does all of the following:

(i) provides a waiver request of additional charges to the tax collector in possession of the claim within twelve months of a qualifying event;

(ii) attests that a notice was not received;

(iii) provides the tax collector in possession of the claim with one of the following:

(A) a copy of the deed showing the date of real property transfer; or

(B) a copy of the title following the acquisition of a mobile or manufactured home subject to taxation as real estate showing the date of issuance or a copy of an executed lease agreement between the owner of a mobile or manufactured home and the owner of a parcel of land on which the mobile or manufactured home will be situated showing the date the lease commences; and

(iv) pays the face value amount of the tax notice for the real estate tax with the waiver request.

(2) The Department of Community and Economic Development shall develop and make available to each taxing district a form by which a taxpayer may request a waiver of additional charges under this section, which shall include a space for attestation by the taxpayer.

(3) A taxpayer granted a waiver and paying real estate tax as provided in this subsection shall not be subject to an action at

law or in equity for an additional charge, and any claim existing or lien filed for an additional charge shall be deemed satisfied.

(4) A tax collector that accepts a waiver and payment in good faith in accordance with this subsection shall not be personally liable for any amount due or arising from the real estate tax that is the subject in the waiver.

(5) As used in this section, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

The term "additional charge" shall mean any interest, fee, penalty or charge accruing to and in excess of the face amount of the real estate tax as provided in the real estate tax notice.

The term "qualifying event" shall mean:

(i) For purposes of real property, the date of transfer of ownership.

(ii) For purposes of manufactured or mobile homes, the date of transfer of ownership or the date a lease agreement commences for the original location or relocation of a mobile or manufactured home on a parcel of land not owned by the owner of the mobile or manufactured home. The term does not include the renewal of a lease for the same location.

The term "tax collector" shall mean a tax collector as defined in section 2, a delinquent tax collector as provided in section 26.1, the tax claim bureau or an alternative collector of taxes as provided in the act of July 7, 1947 (P.L.1368, No.542), known as the "Real Estate Tax Sale Law," an employee, agent or assignee authorized to collect the tax, a purchaser of claim for the tax or any other person authorized by law or contract to secure collection of, or take any action at law or in equity against, the person or property of the taxpayer for the real estate tax or amounts, liens or claims derived from the real estate tax.

Section 2. This act shall take effect in 90 days.

ARP Payment Made — All non-entitlement municipalities should have received their second tranche of ARP funding via direct deposit on September 9. This is a combined deposit that includes the basic funding and the reallocation dollars from communities that opted out of the program. It is the final ARP payment and totals nearly \$500 million statewide. All entitlement communities (*populations over 50,000*) and counties received their money in early summer direct from the U.S. Treasury Department.

2021-2022 Legislative Session Nearing End — The state House will return to session on September 12 and the Senate will reconvene on September 19. Both chambers have three weeks of session scheduled before the November election.

Legislators will be scrambling to move favored bills as any bill that fails to make it to the governor's desk before both chambers break for the election will "die" and need to be reintroduced and begin the process over again in January.

DEP Releases Draft 2022 Water Plan — The state Department of Environmental Protection released the draft 2022 Pennsylvania State Water Plan identifying regional and statewide water resources priorities and recommending statewide and legislative actions to address those priorities. Township officials may review the draft plan and comment on it by **September 19**. PSATS will provide comments from a statewide perspective. Township officials should pay particular attention to regional priorities, as well as any unfunded mandates, and provide input as appropriate. Act 57 Requires Townships to Adopt Tax Resolution — Act 57 of 2022 amends the Local Tax Collection Law to allow taxpayers who fail to receive a tax notice during their first year of occupancy to apply for and receive a waiver and penalties and additional costs from the tax collector. The state Department of Community and Economic Development is required to make a waiver form available. The new act takes effect on October 10.

All townships that levy a property tax are required to adopt a resolution or ordinance directing the elected tax collector to implement the act between October 10 and January 9, 2023. A sample resolution is enclosed and available on psats.org in the PSATS Resource Center (*log-in and then choose the "Legislation & Policy" tab*).

2020 Pennsylvania Broadband Victory Canceled by Feds — The FCC canceled the SpaceX Award to bring internet service to 59,200 unserved Pennsylvanians in 61 counties, stating that the Elon Musk funded private sector satellite initiative failed to demonstrate that it could deliver the promised service. SpaceX won the bid through the Rural Digital Opportunity Fund Program for providing broadband to unserved households and businesses in 35 states. It is unclear how the FCC will resolve this issue and whether the unserved areas will be awarded to another provider.
